



NEXUS Highlighting the Infrastructure for Research and Education Community

Date and place: 28th February 2024, The Hotel, Brussels, Belgium

Background:

On July 19, 2023, the African Union (AU) and the European Union (EU) adopted the AU-EU Innovation Agenda, which aims to transform and expand the capacities and achievements of European and African researchers and innovators into tangible outputs that benefit all sectors, from academia and employment to the private sector.

The AU-EU Innovation Agenda, supported by the Global Gateway, will serve as the cornerstone of Africa-Europe cooperation in science, technology, and innovation for the next decade through four objectives with short-, medium-, and long-term actions organised around priority areas in research and innovation (R&I), science capabilities, and cross-cutting issues through the four priorities, public health, green transition, innovation, and technology.

A welcome development by ASREN- UbuntuNet Alliance and WACREN, the Regional Research and Education Network (RREN) implementing partners of the AfricaConnect project, supports 38 National Research and Education Network (NREN) organisations connecting over 5 million end-users across 1900 institutions in Africa.

In Europe, GÉANT and NORDUnet collaborate with the national NRENs to provide Europe's learners, faculty, and researchers with optimal infrastructure, recognising that an interconnected community is fundamental to establishing a sustainable Research and Education community. The European NREN community embodies this conviction by fostering an environment that intentionally encourages innovation and advancement through collaborative endeavours that demonstrate a resilient ecosystem conducive to the flourishing of ideas and the seamless exchange of knowledge across boundaries.

To this end, GÉANT, NORDUnet, and the Guild are convening a multistakeholder event focusing on how National Research and Education Networks can support ongoing planned initiatives between the Nordic and African universities. The event will focus on strengthening and supporting the community of end-users of higher education and research institutions through NREN.

Specifically, the conference:

Highlight the requirements for infrastructure and tools for some of the use cases that are addressed by existing projects between the Nordic and African Universities

Showcase how the R&E infrastructure can enable cross-border scientific collaboration. Cultivate multistakeholder collaborations.

















Format of the event:

Nexus is intended to be an interactive, in-person, multi-stakeholder discussion between the panellist and the audience, composed of key actors. The event will consist of five sessions, each moderated by an expert and joined by pre-identified panellists invited to share their expertise.
